Impervious Surfaces

Impervious surfaces, mapped here from the state land cover designations, are artificial structures like roads, sidewalks, parking lots, and rooftops. About 11 square miles of Newark or 42 percent, is covered by surfaces that are 85 percent or more impervious. About 3.7 square miles of Newark's surface is permeable, 2.2 square miles of which is surface water
