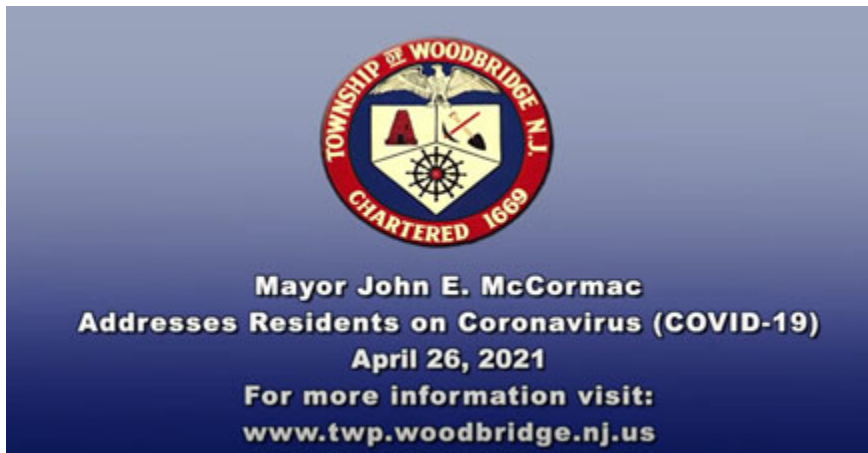

This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Monday, April 26.

The Township numbers are really declining lately as we had only 72 new cases of Coronavirus from the general public over the weekend with 26 on Friday, 27 on Saturday and 19 on Sunday for a three day average of 24. The only time all year when we had less than 24 cases over three days was during the snowstorm in February when many testing sites were closed.

Our current seven day rolling average is the lowest we have had since early November which is more terrific news.

There were no new cases in outside facilities and the only sad news is the report of a death of a 57 year-old male in town from COVID-19, so please keep him and his family in your thoughts and prayers.

Governor Murphy today raised the indoor room capacity to 50% with a maximum of 250 individuals effective May 10 for private catered events, including school proms, weddings, funerals, memorial services, performances and political events. Dance floors will be permitted with masking and social distancing requirements in place.

The limits are expected to be increased again around Memorial Day which will be good news for all graduation ceremonies and more guidance on that topic is expected to be released later today.

Effective May 10, the outdoor gathering limit will be increased to 500 people and for large venues with 1,000 or more fixed seats the limits will increase to 50% of capacity, also with proper social distancing. Outdoor carnivals and fairs can operate at 50% of capacity.

If any Woodbridge resident still needs a vaccine please call the Health Department at: 732-855- 0600 extension 5004. We have clinics scheduled for Tuesday from 10:00 AM – and Thursday from 3:00 – 6:00 PM at our Health Center between the Main and Woodbridge High School.

Our Earth Day celebration Saturday from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM in the Town parking lot is getting bigger and better with a pop-up library and several shows and a children's book author. There will be a toy exchange, fitness environmental tours, free tree seedlings and plenty of vendors and giveaways. Parking is available in all of the train station lots.
