Howell's Shade Tree Commission made sure Arbor Day in Howell was a great success this year, even in these trying times. A total of 567 Tublings were given to the 3rd grade students in each of Howell's five (5) Elementary Schools, along with 26 Azalea Bushes and 5 Dogwood Trees. Additionally, 7 Dogwood Trees were given to the remaining schools in Howell. All trees, bushes and tublings were purchased by Howell. Normally, members of the Howell Shade Tree Commission speak at each school while presenting the trees, however because of COVID, Howell's Shade Tree Commission created a Video that was played at each of the schools.

Eighth annual NJ Tree Recovery Campaign, 1000 seedlings given away on 24 April 2021. Distributed 567 seedlings, 26 Azalea bushes, and 12 Dogwood trees to Howell's Elementary Schools on 29 Apr 2021for Arbor Day. Attended Howell Day, passing out brochures and informing residents the benefits we get from trees. Howell STC had a second seedling give away on 2 October, 2021.

Howell Shade Tree Commission took an unused, overgrown dog park, and started turning it into a Community Wildlife Habitat. After DPW cleaned up the 3+/- AC site, the STC members and volunteers planted over 200 trees and shrubs, and installed tree protection. While this block only requests one highlight from last year, there is another that I feel compelled to mention. Each Spring, Howell has been an active participant with New Jersey's Tree Recovery Campaign. This year, the STC decided that with the great success of the spring seedling giveaway, they purchased and distributed seedlings in a second, Town run giveaway. Again, this event was greatly appreciated by the residents, and was a huge success.
