Message From Mayor John E. McCormac

Dear Woodbridge Township Resident:

We are pleased to provide the 2022 Woodbridge Township Sanitation & Recycling calendar. This year, the calendar highlights many new recycling initiatives and sustainable projects and programs that have spearheaded Woodbridge garnering the New Jersey League of Municipalities Sustainable Jersey™ Silver-Level Championship title for the past 11 years. As we continue to work our way through

the COVID-19 pandemic, we are pleased to report that the Woodbridge Township Department of Public Works and the Office of Recycling continued to provide outstanding service to Township residents – in fact, it's important to note that last year, the Office of Recycling earned \$239,802 from the State of New Jersey's Recycling Tonnage Grant program which is based on the amount/tonnage of materials collected and recycled along with \$175,035 from the Clean Communities Grant. The funding and grants allowed for the expansion of the ReUse It Center at the Public Works facility in Keasbey and expanded our recycling efforts to include the recycling of Styrofoam, cooking oil(s) and certain plastic bags, film and shrink-wrap. Additionally, Public Works moved to the next generation of sustainability with the purchase – again via grant funding – of three state-of-the-art fully electric sanitation vehicles. Throughout the year, the Department of Public Works continued to implement many more sustainable initiatives and programs that serve to better manage the ways we offer sanitation services, conserve energy and other natural resources at work and home.

The Recycle Coach APP – customized to your address - accompanies the 2022 calendar. The Recycle Coach APP highlights trash and recycling collection schedules, special collection information and more - right at your fingertips!!! Search the 'What Goes Here' database for specific recycling instructions. Keep track of upcoming special collection events such as the household hazardous waste drop-off, confidential document shredding day, Christmas tree collection, bagged leaf collection, and more. Report a waste problem or send comments and suggestions through the APP. Visit the Township web page at www.twp.woodbridge.nj.us for more information.

Once again, we are anxiously looking forward to hosting the Township-wide yard sale weekend this spring...Saturday, April 23, 2022: Woodbridge, Port Reading, Sewaren and Avenel...Saturday, April 30, 2022: Fords, Keasbey, Hopelawn and Menlo Park Terrace...Saturday, May 14, 2022: Iselin...Saturday, May 21, 2022: Colonia... Ferry Street To Rent a Bike

Go to Google Play (Android) or App Store (Apple) and download the Movatic APP.

In the Movatic App click a pin on the map for the bike station you want to rent a bike from. Press "Select a Bike".

When at the station, select the bicycle you want to checkout. Enter the bike number, then press "Rent Bike". The App will use your phone's Bluetooth to unlock bike from rack. NOTE: You must be within 4-5 feet of the bicycle you wish to checkout.

The lock will beep and flash. You will have 10 seconds to release the bike from the rack. Once the bike is detached from the rack, press "Continue". If bike does not unlock, press "Try Unlocking Again". NOTE: Inspect bike prior to each ride. Do not ride the bike if it needs service.





To Return a Bike

Roll bike up to rack and secure lock to rack pin. Confirm bike is secured to rack.

The bottom of the screen will indicate you have an active rental. Press on the Active circle to see your current rental.

Press the "End Rental" button and confirm the bike has been returned to the correct station.



NJ Bag Ban Law

WHAT'S BANNED, WHAT'S NOT



In 2020 Governor Phil Murphy signed a bill pertaining to plastic and paper bags, plastic straws and polystyrene foam containers. The major part of this bill will take effect this month. The law prohibits grocery, retail stores and restaurants from providing or selling single-use plastic carryout bags and grocery stores from providing single-use paper carryout bags. The phasing out of polystyrene foam food service products will also start this month. One part of the law concerning plastic straws took effect last November. Plastic straws are now given out 'by request only'. This law is aimed at reducing litter and conserving our natural resources!

Bag Ban countdown....3 days and it's here!

October Spotlight On

Leaves and Litter



During and after a rainfall, stormwater brings leaves and litter that has gathered on streets and sidewalks into storm drains.

When this happens two main things occur:

1. Residential Flooding- Leaves and litter can clog up stormdrains, making it difficult for the water to properly drain. This can cause street and property flooding.

2. Poor Water Quality- When water flows through piles of leaves, phosphorus quickly leaches out of the leaves. This phosphorus enriched water then flows to our waterways causing algae blooms, turning the water green and smelly while lowering the oxygen level in the water. This then harms our plants and wildlife that live in and rely on this water. Litter has the same effect, when it breaks down in the water it releases harmfulcontaminates.

Remember litter travels, but it can stop with you!

Put your lawn mower to good use this fall... "mulch your leaves and go"! Use your lawn mower to mulch your leaves where they fall.

You can then leave them on your lawn. add them to your garden/flower beds or put them in your compost pile. BUT if you must bag them...

Starting October 1st leaf bags will be available at the Public Works Complex located at 225 Smith Street Keasbey. Only leaves in biodegradable paper bags will be collected. No plastic bags! Leaves placed in the street can be dangerous. They can clog storm drains and cause flooding, reduce the width of roads, and create hazardous driving conditions. If you are going to schedule a loose leaf pick-up, payment must be received and a pick-up date given, before any leaves may be placed at the curb.

Paper gift wrap and tissue paper can be recycled, but NOT paper that has glitter or foil on it.



When you're done unwrapping your gifts, empty and break down the boxes and put them in your recycling cart.

Bring your own reusable shopping bag. Plastic bags are big troublemakers for the sorting equipment at recycling facilities. Or, if you use those plastic bags, be sure to bring them back to the store for recycling.

Holiday lights do not belong in recycling carts. Stringy decorations like holiday lights create a mess once inside recycling facilities. Put them in the trash, or, you can also bring them to the Recycling Center!

Each Day, sorters at the recycling center struggle to remove OVER 35,000 POUNDS Of items that should NEVER be put into recycling carts or recycling dumpsters.

Snow Plowing

During the winter months the safety of Woodbridge Township residents is a primary concern of the Department of Public Works.

As a rule, arterial and primary roads are plowed and salted as a first priority. Once these roads are cleared, the plowing and salting begins on all other roads.

Residents can assist our snow removal operations by:

- 1. When snow is predicted, remove all vehicles from streets until plowing is complete.
- 2. Do not shovel snow into the street.
- 3. Please remember that when the plow goes by, snow will be deposited on your driveway apron, so, do not shovel your driveway apron until plowing operations are complete.
- 4. Play it safe! Do not drive unless it is absolutely necessary.











Protect Our Natural Floodplains

Only rain goes down the storm drain. The ability for storm drain systems to function correctly directly relates to minimizing flood inundation, potential damage sustained during strong rain events, and the reduction of non-point source pollution into our waterways. Natural habitats are the definition of resilient infrastructure, as they are more readily able to rebound after powerful storm events. In addition to providing flood storage capacity, these areas are havens for safeguarding the existing benefits associated with healthy natural areas, such as filtration of nutrient runoff and biodiversity. Know Your Flood Hazard

Woodbridge Township has areas of special flood hazards located in the AE, A, Coastal A, and VE zones. You can locate Special Flood Hazard Areas in your neighborhood by looking at the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) at FEMA's Map Service Center or on the Township's floodplain management website, via the Woodbridge Township Interactive Flood Viewer which shows both the 2010 Effective FIRM and 2014 Preliminary FIRM, or by visiting our FEMA Flood Zones link on the Township's floodplain management webpage.

Woodbridge Township contains areas of tidal and fluvial flooding. Never drive down flooded roadways. For your safety, our web pages have links to real-time tide gauge data. The Township of Woodbridge participates in the Middlesex County Hazard Mitigation Plan. The plan is designed to help identify local weaknesses and assess ways to potentially combat those issues. Thus, the overall outcome of the plan's development is to reduce devastating effects of future storm events and other natural hazards. Build Responsibly

If you are in the market to potentially purchase property, you should examine any possibility of a flood hazard BEFORE YOU BUY & BEFORE YOU BUILD, and the need to have flood insurance to protect yourselves and your property. Historic flood risk may not be the same risk you face today or in the future. By rebuilding higher, you can reduce-or avoid-future flood loss and reduce the impact on your finances. The Township recognizes The New Jersey State Flood Hazard Area (FHA) Control

Act Rules, N.J.A.C. 7:13. Please note that in situations where the base flood elevation (BFE) denotes a more protective delineation, the State of New Jersey is using the information as the basis for statewide floodplain development standards. To learn more about the types of N.J. Flood Hazard Area Permit Authorizations, visit our Floodplain Management website and to view the Township's Municipal Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance, including Chapter 22 of the General Ordinance and the Township's Open Space Conservation & Resilience Zone Ordinance (OSC/R Zone).

Carry Flood Insurance

Federal law requires that a Flood Insurance Policy be obtained as a condition of a federally backed mortgage or loan that is secured by the structure located in an area of special flood hazard, as per the Effective Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) delineation. Although some areas susceptible to flood risk do not require the purchase of flood insurance, it is recommended in order to best minimize financial vulnerability during a potential flood event. It's important to carry flood insurance even if you are not federally required to do so. According to FEMA, a structure located in a Special Flood Hazard Area has a 26% annual chance of experiencing a 1% annual exceedance probability flood (100-year flood event) over the course of a 30 year mortgage. A property not in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) may be damaged by a flood greater than that predicted on a flood study, such as a FIRM or state delineation. According to FEMA nearly 25% of all National Flood Insurance Program flood insurance claims come from policy holders outside of federally mapped Special Flood Hazard Areas. Learn more about Preferred Risk Policy premiums available through the NFIP, which offer lower-cost coverage for structures mapped outside the SFHA.

*Never drive on flooded roads - almost half of flood deaths happen in vehicles *6 inches of water is enough to cause you to lose control of your vehicle *If you encounter flood waters on a roadway Turn Around, Don't Drown.

During and After a Flood Event

COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Woodbridge Township Division of Engineering, in conjunction with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), implements the Community Rating System. For detailed FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) determinations based on a street address which delineate floodways, limits of wave action, state protected natural areas, NOAA sea-level-rise data, historical extents of flood inundation, and flood depths contact the Woodbridge Township Division of Engineering for assistance: 732-602-6057. In addition, the Township offers flood protection assistance information in order to help property owners reduce vulnerability from flood related hazards. Flood-proofing techniques vary in size, scale and scope in relation to specific flood hazard conditions and the use of the structure. Some retrofitting alternatives might include elevating the structure, constructing engineered flood walls and protecting utilities from flood vulnerability. This service is intended to help provide one-on-one assistance to property owners in order to evaluate potential flood protection options. This service is not intended to function as means by which to offer design, engineering, or construction project support. Interested parties should contact the Division of Engineering in order to arrange for a consultation. Be sure to obtain all necessary permits before construction. NOTE: Consultation is based on the available "Flood Insurance Rate Maps(s)" of the municipality. This consultation does not imply that the referenced property will or will not be free from flooding or damage. A property may be damaged by a flood greater than that predicted on the FIRM or from a local drainage problem not shown on the map. This consultation does not create liability on the part of the municipality, or any officer, or employee thereof, for any damage that results from reliance on consultation determinations.
