- \Rightarrow As of May 4, 2022 in accordance with NJ State Law - No store shall provide or sell single-use plastic carryout bags to customers, and grocery stores (over 2,500 sq. ft.) shall not provide or sell single-use paper carryout bags to customers. Make sure to keep your reusable bags with you when you leave home!
