Climate change-induced extreme weather impacts the poor first and hardest, who can least afford lost jobs and wages, repairs to damaged homes, and loss of vehicles needed for work. Most have nowhere to go to escape danger or to recover. Those suffering the most from the problems must be involved in solving them.

Since 1976, ESWA has built a grass-roots membership organizing drive to reverse the conditions that are killing and disabling low-income workers and their families, and to gain control over our living and working conditions.

ESWA's uniquely successful method of systemic organizing enables anyone who cares and is willing to work to join in building an organization to fight to end policies that keep us poor and destroy our communities.

With ESWA, you can:

UNITE All low-income workers through door-to-door canvasses and house meetings in neighborhoods hit hardest by poverty and climate change.

ADVOCATE for low-income families to prevent electric and gas shutoffs; win cases against wage theft; fight to reverse government policies that enrich utility companies and promote use of fossil fuels.

ORGANIZE membership benefits of emergency and supplemental food, preventive medical care, legal assistance and other survival benefits to keep ESWA members on their feet and able to fight.

WRITE, DESIGN AND PUBLISH ESWA's independent newspaper that provides a voice to ESWA's membership of low-paid service workers as a benefit of membership and to inform others of the truth.

THE BATTLE TO WIN AGAINST CLIMATE CHANGE DEPENDS ON US

More than six years later,
1,000 New Jersey residents
still haven't recovered their homes from the damage wrought by Superstorm Sandy.

Homes in poor & minority communities are on average **22°F HOTTER** in the summer than homes in wealthier communities.

1/3 of workers in the U.S. make **LESS** than **\$12** an hour.

Who is Left Drowning in Disaster?

The average temperature in New Jersey is now 3° F higher than it was 100 years ago. Statewide, heat stress already causes 950 emergency room visits and 150 hospitalizations per year. Cramped in small living quarters, frequently working outdoors or in stifling, unconditioned spaces, low-income workers and their families are the first and hardest hit. Superstorm Sandy destroyed or damaged 650,000 homes, cut power to eight million customers and killed 159 people. A government climate model predicts 32 super-extreme storms with sustained winds above 190 miles per hour before 2035.
