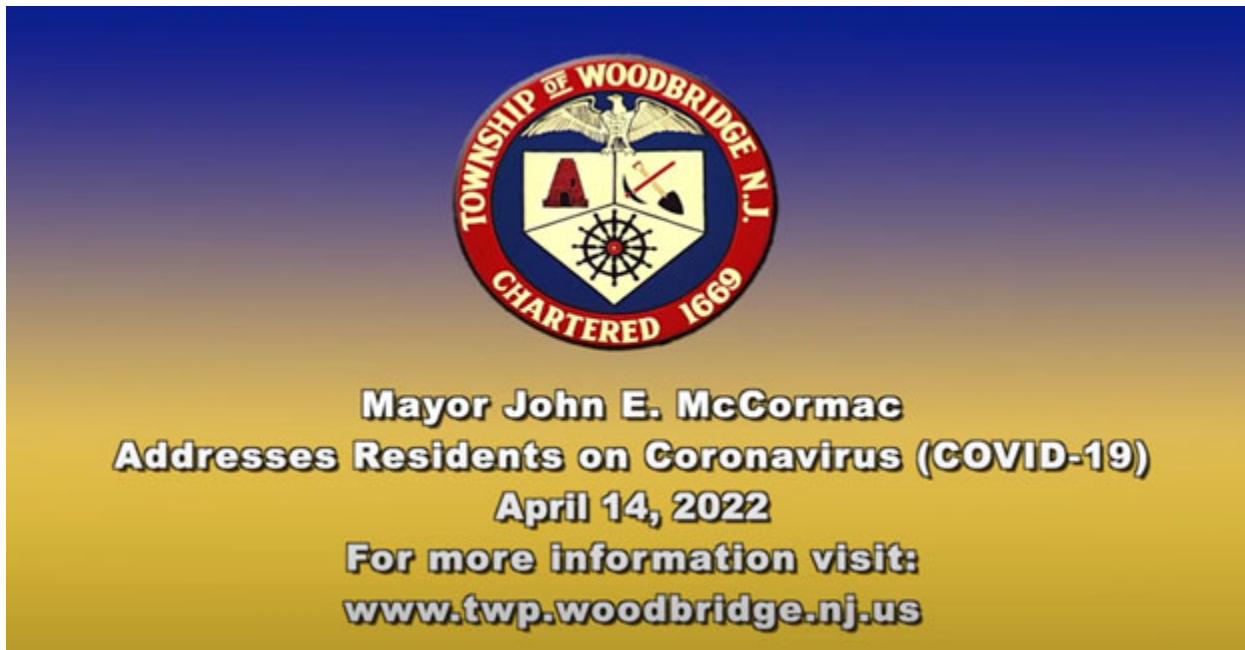

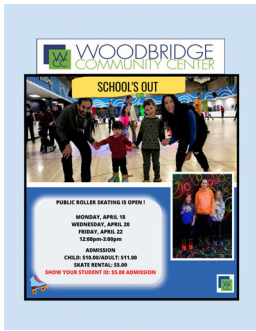

This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Thurs., April 14.



Today's report is for six days since we are off tomorrow and next week's will be for eight days.

There were 98 new cases of Coronavirus from the general public in the last six days which is a daily average of 16, which is the same as the first part of April. In February and March, our daily average was 36 and in January it was 67. The numbers are definitely down but they are not quite going away.

We are happy to once again not be reporting any new deaths from COVID in Woodbridge.

The Township has a double vaccination clinic at our Health Center on Tues., April 19 – one for those 12 and over from 2:00 to 4:00 PM and one for children under 12 from 4:00 to 6:00 PM.

The Woodbridge Elks have a Fish & Chips/Pizza event tomorrow from 6:00 to 7:30 PM at their Lodge home. The Rolling Torahs are playing at Curtains Restaurant tomorrow at 7:00 PM.

Applebee's in Woodbridge Center has a breakfast with the Easter Bunny from 8:00 to 10:30 AM Saturday with proceeds to benefit the relief efforts in Ukraine.

The Township's annual Easter Bonnet Parade and Egg Hunt will be at Evergreen Senior Center on Saturday at 1:00 PM. Mark Mayer is appearing at Curtains on Saturday at 7:00 PM.

The Woodbridge Community Center has expanded hours next week during Spring Break for skating, mini-golf and batting cages with special discounts for children so stop by and have some fun.

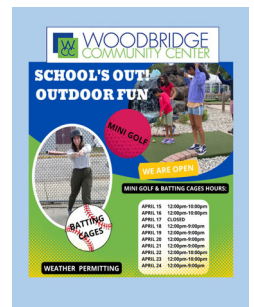
Big Wheels Day returns to the Woodbridge Center parking lot Wednesday from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM with dozens of different vehicles.

And, what is a good gift for the Easter Bunny? Anything made of 14 CARROT gold!!!!

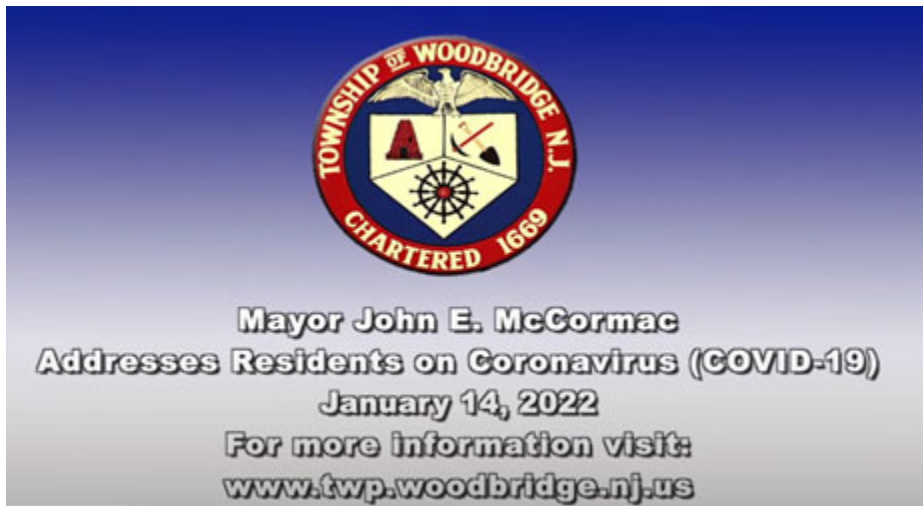

This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Friday, January 14.

Well, the bad news is that we had our second highest weekly total ever with 1,631 new cases of Coronavirus from the general public in Woodbridge last week but the good news is that figure is over 1,000 lower than the week before when we had 2,698. Hopefully, this trend continues and the numbers keep going down and it could be that the worst is behind us.

There were another 82 cases in State facilities and seven in health care facilities and unfortunately, we have one death to report of a 90 year-old female. Please keep her and her family in your thoughts and prayers.

We have vaccination clinics for ages 5-11 the next two Tuesdays from 4:00 to 6:00 PM and for those 12 and older on the next two Thursdays from 1:00 to 6:00 PM all at our Health Center. Call 732-855-0600 extension 5004 to book your time.

Our vaccination numbers show that nearly 100% of our population aged 65 and up has received at least one dose of the vaccine. For those 18 and up the number is 92%, for those from 12-17 the number is 80% and for 5-11 it is 43%.

Yesterday Governor Murphy reinstated a Public Health Emergency effective immediately to ensure that the State of New Jersey can continue to respond to the continued threat of COVID-19. All details of that announcement are on our Township web site.

It's Girl Scout cookie time again. Troops will be out tomorrow from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM at the Evergreen Senior Center in Colonia, Woodbridge Community Center and the Town Hall parking lot and on Sunday from 9:30 AM to 1:30 PM in the Lee's Auto Body parking lot on Route 35 in Avenel.

We have filmed our virtual tribute to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and it will be aired for the first time on Monday, his birthday, at 1:00 PM and many times after that.

Our crews are preparing for bad weather this weekend and our salt trucks and plows will be ready to roll if we get accumulations of snow and sleet.

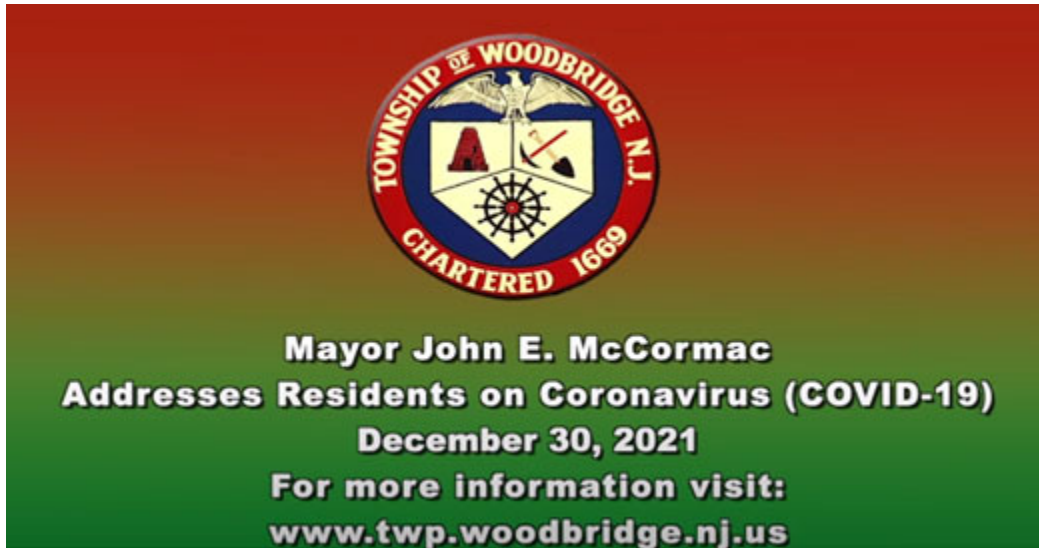

This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Friday, December 30.

The Township had our worst week ever with a staggering 1,350 new cases of Coronavirus in the last seven days. Last week's count of 788 shattered the weekly record of 504 and now this week shattered that record. We had 1,004 cases the entire summer of 2021 and more than that just this past week.

Despite all the craziness there were no new deaths to report as the Omicron variant is much less severe than Delta so that is the good news.

Our January 4 and January 6 vaccination clinics are fully booked but we have one for ages 5-11 on Tues., Jan. 11 from 4:00 – 6:00 PM and one for ages 12 and up on Thurs., Jan. 13 from 1:00 to 6:00 PM at our Health Center. Call 732-855-0600 extension 5004 for an appointment.

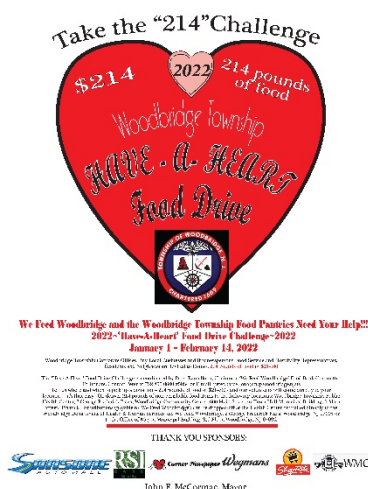
The New Jersey Department of Health has shortened the recommended time for isolation from 10 days to five for individuals with COVID if they no longer have symptoms followed by five days of wearing a mask around others.

Unvaccinated individuals who were exposed to COVID or those more than six months out of their second dose of Moderna or Pfizer or more than two months out of J&J who have not received a booster shot should quarantine for five days after exposure followed by mask use for five days.

Individuals who have received booster shots do not have to quarantine after exposure but should wear a mask for 10 days after.

COVID testing sites are very busy and you can find them at covid19.nj.gov/pages/testing by entering your zip code.

The Hematology and Oncology Cancer Care Center at 530 Green Street in Iselin right behind the Dunkin Donuts on Route One North just started offering testing but is not in the directory yet. They are open 2:00 to 8:00 PM today and weekdays. The company also donated over 100 winter coats to children in town and we greatly appreciate that.



All of this information is on our Township web site and social media pages along with all contact information for the Department of Health.

Our Have-A-Heart Food Drive kicks off in the New Year and runs until Valentine's Day on February 14. Food donations typically drop off after the holidays but the demand does not. All locations for drop offs can be found on our web site.

Our virtual Interfaith salute to Martin Luther King, Jr. will air on Mon., Jan. 17 at 1:00 PM and will be repeated many other times on TV-35.

Sewaren resident Jarred Tolley, who has played piano at Carnegie Hall, is playing at Curtains Restaurant tonight at 7:00 PM. A band called Hollow Molly is playing next Fri., Jan. 7 also at 7:00 PM.
