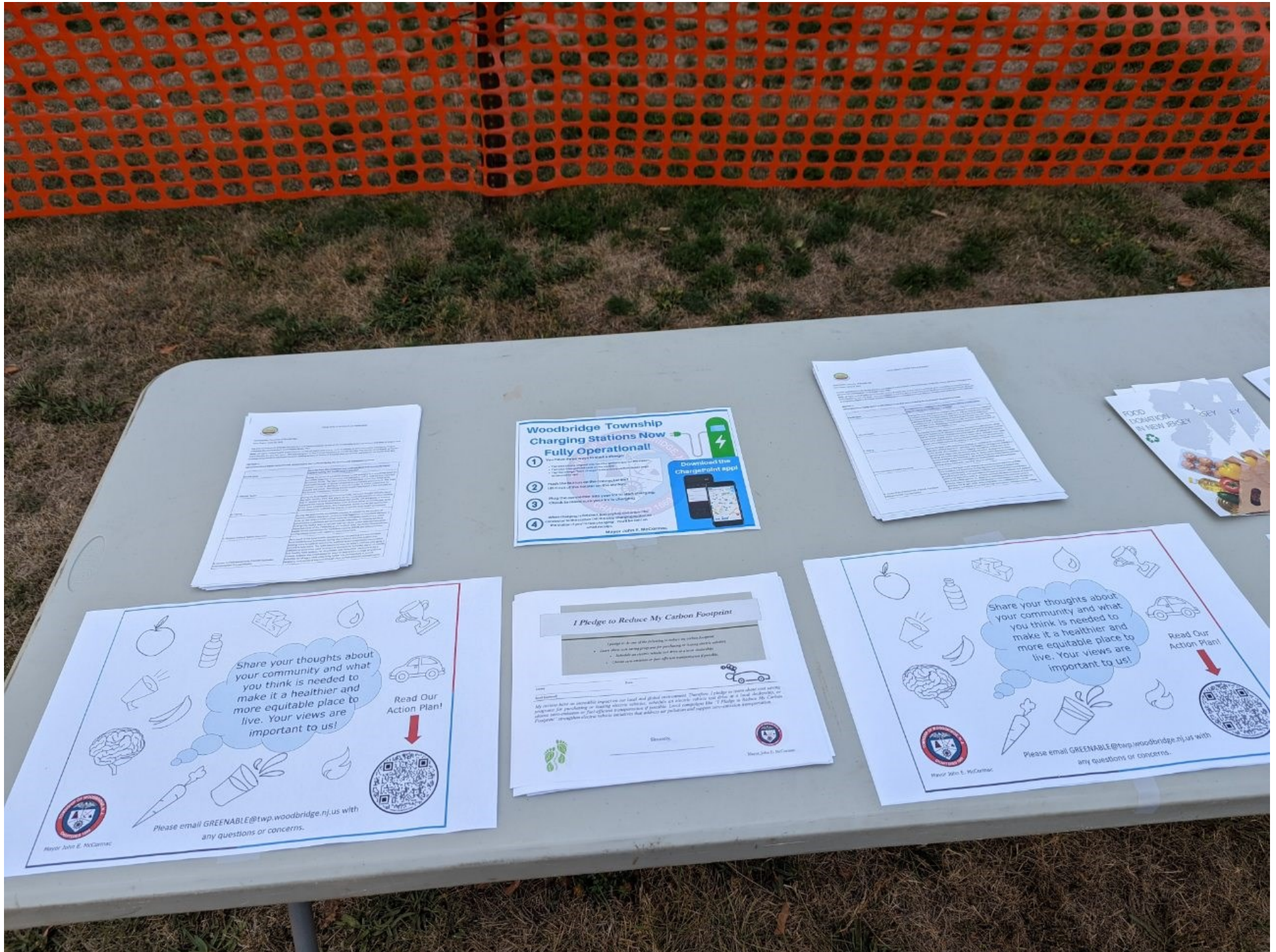

Woodbridge Town Charging Station Fully Operational


- 1 You have three ways to start a charge:
 - Tap your phone (paired into the ChargePoint app)
 - Tap your ChargePoint card on the station
 - Tap the orange "Start Charge" button in the middle of the station
- 2 Push the button on the connector to lift it out of the holster on the station.
- 3 Plug the connector into your vehicle. Check to make sure your vehicle is properly connected.
- 4 When charging is finished, disconnect the connector from the station. If you're fast, you can also use the station to charge your phone.

This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Friday, August 19.

The Township had a nice drop in the number of new cases of Coronavirus over the last seven days with 203 – our lowest weekly number since the end of April. We have averaged 314 new cases per week for these last 15 weeks so the drop is significant. Let's hope we can maintain this trend.

We have vaccination clinics for those 12 and over this Thursday August 25 and also on September 8 from 4-6 at our Health Center with no appointments required and for those

under 12 a week from Tuesday on August 30 and on Thursday September 15 also from 4-6 with appointments required by calling 732 855 0600 extension 5004.

The Farmer's Market returned to the Town Hall parking lot tomorrow from 9-1.

August is National Immunization Month and our Township Health Action Plan includes a wide array of services, clinics, health screenings and immunizations that our Health Department provides so check it out on line and provide feedback or visit our table at the Farmer's Market.

Tomorrow is also the Children's Clothes Closet at the First Presbyterian Church of Woodbridge from 10-1.
